tration in the city of Fall River shall be appointed by the mayor with confirmation by the city council and shall be employed by contract for a period of not more than three years and shall represent the mayor in the conduct of all labor relations pursuant to chapter one hundred and fifty E of the General Laws. The terms and conditions of such contract shall be determined by the mayor and shall be approved by the city council.

SECTION 2. Notwithstanding the provisions of said section fifty-two of said chapter forty-three or the provisions of any other general or special law to the contrary, the personnel advisory board of the city of Fall River shall consist of three persons, one of whom shall be appointed by the mayor and shall represent management, one of whom shall be elected by employees in the manner provided by city ordinance to represent labor, and ex-officio, the president of the city council. The person appointed by the mayor shall be a resident of the city and shall have been a resident of said city at least two years immediately preceding the date of his appointment. Members shall serve until their successors are chosen and qualified.

Chap. 77. AN ACT INCREASING THE PENSION BENEFITS PAYABLE TO RITA CLOUGHERTY BY THE STATE-BOSTON RETIREMENT SYSTEM.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Notwithstanding the provisions of any law to the contrary and in order to promote the public good, the State-Boston retirement board is hereby authorized and directed to pay to Rita Clougherty the widow of Paul Clougherty, who died on December twenty-sixth, nineteen hundred and eighty-two as a result of injuries sustained on December twenty-sixth, nineteen hundred and eighty-two while in the performance of his duties as supervisor of parks and recreation in the city of Boston an accidental death benefit allowance from the date of his death under section nine of chapter thirty-two of the General Laws. Said accidental death benefit allowance subject to the provisions and limitations of said section nine shall consist of a yearly amount of such allowance equal to the annual rate of regular compensation which would have been payable to said Paul Clougherty had he continued in the service of the city of Boston at the grade held by him at the time of his death. The payments of such pension shall be diminished by the amounts payable to the dependents of

said Paul Clougherty under the provisions of section thirty-one of chapter one hundred and fifty-two of the General Laws.

Chap. 78. AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE SALARIES OF THE MEMBERS OF THE BOSTON LICENSING BOARD.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 291 of the acts of 1906 is hereby amended by striking out section 2, as most recently amended by section 1 of chapter 413 of the acts of 1975, and inserting in place thereof the following section:-

Section 2. The annual salary of the chairman of said board shall be thirty-seven thousand dollars and that of each of the other two members, thirty-five thousand dollars, and that of the secretary, thirty-five thousand dollars. Such salaries shall be paid in monthly installments by the city of Boston.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect as of January first, nineteen hundred and eighty-three.

Chap. 79. AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE TIME PERIOD FOR THE RECERTIFICATION OF LOCAL PROPERTY TAX VALUATION.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. The first paragraph of section 56 of chapter 40 of the General Laws, as most recently amended by section 1 of chapter 369 of the acts of 1982, is hereby further amended by striking out the first sentence and inserting in place thereof the following sentence:- The commissioner shall triennially certify as to whether the board of assessors is assessing property at full and fair cash valuation.

SECTION 2. This act shall apply to real and personal property taxes imposed for fiscal years commencing on or after July first, nineteen hundred and eighty-three.
