AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF NEWTON TO SELL AND CONVEY A CERTAIN PARCEL OF LAND KNOWN AS THE CLAFLIN SCHOOL PROPERTY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The City of Newton is hereby authorized to sell
2 and convey a certain parcel of land located in said city, said parcel
3 being any and all land known as the Claflin School property,
4 containing approximately 217,323 square feet in area, and with all
5 improvements thereon, originally acquired by said city for school
6 and school yard purposes, and located on Lowell Avenue in the
7 Newtonville section of the City of Newton.

8 The above described parcel is shown as Section 24, Block 25 Lot
9 9 on the Books of the Assessors of the City of Newton.

1 SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect upon its passage.
