commission of a felony, uses or wears any body armor, so-called, or any protective covering for the body or any parts thereof, made of resin-treated glass-fiber cloth, or of any other material or combination of materials, designed to prevent, deflect or deter the penetration thereof by ammunition, knives or other weapons, shall be punished by imprisonment in the state prison for not less than two and one-half years nor more than five years or for not less than one year nor more than two and one-half years in a jail or house of correction.

Chap. 140. AN ACT AUTHORIZING JAMES F. SHEEHAN TO TAKE A CIVIL SERVICE EXAMINATION FOR THE POSITION OF FIREFIGHTER NOTWITHSTANDING THE MAXIMUM AGE REQUIREMENTS.

Whereas, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to immediately allow James F. Sheehan to take a civil service examination for the position of firefighter, therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience. \_\_\_\_\_

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law or rule to the contrary regulating the maximum age of an applicant for appointment as a firefighter, James F. Sheehan of the town of Westwood shall be eligible to take the next open competitive examination for the position of firefighter and provided he meets all other requirements, he shall be eligible for certification and appointment to said position.
