for licenses or from the sale of dog licenses by the town of Hopedale, or recovered as fines or penalties by said town under the provisions of said chapter one hundred and forty relating to dogs, shall be paid into the treasury of said town and shall not thereafter be paid over by the town treasurer to the county of Worcester.

SECTION 3. Notwithstanding the provisions of section one hundred and thirty-seven of said chapter one hundred and forty or any other provision of law to the contrary, the registration, numeral listing, description and licensing of dogs, if kept in said town, shall be conducted in the office of the town clerk of said town.

Chap. 158. AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE LICENSING AND KEEPING OF DOGS IN THE TOWN OF KINGSTON.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of section one hundred and thirty-nine of chapter one hundred and forty of the General Laws or any other general or special law to the contrary, the annual fees to be charged by the town of Kingston for the issuance of licenses for dogs shall be as follows: unspayed and unneutered dogs six dollars; spayed and neutered dogs three dollars.

SECTION 2. Notwithstanding the provisions of section one hundred and forty-seven of said chapter one hundred and forty or any other general or special law to the contrary, all money received for licenses or from the sale of dog licenses by the town of Kingston or recovered as fines or penalties by said town under the provisions of said chapter one hundred and forty relating to dogs shall be paid into the treasury of said town and shall not thereafter be paid over by the town treasurer to the county of Plymouth.

SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any provision of the law to the contrary, any animal pound as defined in section one of chapter forty-nine A of the General Laws which is located in said town is hereby exempt from the provisions of section three of said chapter forty-nine A, and no such animal pound located in said town shall be permitted to deliver from its available impounded animals any animal to a licensee as defined in said section one of

said chapter forty-nine A for the purpose of scientific investigation, experimentation, instruction or testing of drugs and medicine.

Chap. 159. AN ACT INCREASING THE FEES FOR JUSTICES OF THE PEACE TO SOLEMNIZE MARRIAGES.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Chapter 262 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out section 35, as most recently amended by section 2 of chapter 521 of the acts of 1981, and inserting in place thereof the following section:-

Section 35. The fee for lawfully solemnizing and certifying a marriage shall not exceed thirty-five dollars if performed in the justice of the peace's home community or fifty dollars if performed in any municipality in the commonwealth; provided, however, that no additional charge shall be made for travel in connection with such solemnization notwithstanding any law to the contrary.

Chap. 160. AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE MEETINGS OF THE BOARD OF STATE EXAMINERS OF PLUMBERS.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Chapter 13 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out section 37, as most recently amended by chapter 102 of the acts of 1966, and inserting in place thereof the following section:-

Section 37. The examiners shall hold meetings at such times and places as they may designate.

Chap. 161. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF GLOUCESTER TO ISSUE TO LOUIS A. LINQUATA A LICENSE FOR THE SALE OF ALL ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES NOT TO BE DRUNK ON THE PREMISES.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:
