

ACTS, 1983. - Chaps. 191, 192.

Chap. 191. AN ACT FURTHER ESTABLISHING THE AMOUNT OF CERTAIN RETIREMENT AND DEATH BENEFITS WHICH MAY BE PAID BY THE BELMONT POLICE RELIEF ASSOCIATION, INCORPORATED.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. The Belmont Police Relief Association, Incorporated, a corporation duly established under the laws of the commonwealth, is hereby authorized to pay an amount not exceeding ten thousand dollars to the designated beneficiary of a nonretired member of the association upon the death of said member; and also to pay an amount not exceeding ten thousand dollars to the designated beneficiary of a retired member of said corporation who is a permanent officer of the town of Belmont police department upon the death of said member.

SECTION 2. The Belmont Police Relief Association, Incorporated is hereby authorized to pay an amount not exceeding ten thousand dollars to a member of the corporation in good standing with ten or more years service as a permanent officer of the town of Belmont police department upon said member's retirement or any member with less than ten years service who by reason of a job related disability retires as a permanent police officer.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect as of May first, nineteen hundred and eighty-two.

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Chap. 192. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF SOUTHWICK TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE TOWN OF SUFFIELD IN THE STATE OF CONNECTICUT FOR THE PURPOSES OF WATERSHED MANAGEMENT AND LAKE RESTORATION FOR THE CONGAMOND LAKES.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

The town of Southwick is hereby authorized to enter into agreements with the town of Suffield in the state of Connecticut, for the purposes of watershed management and in-lake restoration for the Congamond Lakes when said town of Suffield, is duly authorized to do so by the state of Connecticut. The town of Southwick is further authorized to expend monies in conjunction

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with said town of Suffield to further the purposes of such agreements.

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Chap. 193. AN ACT PERMITTING THE HOLDER OF A LEARNER'S PERMIT TO BE ACCOMPANIED BY CERTAIN MEMBERS OF THE ARMED FORCES, WHILE OPERATING A MOTOR VEHICLE.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

The first paragraph of section 8B of chapter 90 of the General Laws, as most recently amended by section 5 of chapter 261 of the acts of 1976, is hereby further amended by striking out the third sentence and inserting in place thereof the following sentence:- The registrar, after the applicant has successfully passed all parts of the examination other than the driving test, may issue to the applicant a learner's permit which shall entitle him, while having such permit in his immediate possession, to drive a motor vehicle upon any way when accompanied by an operator, licensed by the registrar, and who is eighteen years of age or over, who has had at least one year of driving experience or who is the parent of the applicant and is on active duty in the armed forces of the United States on assignment in the commonwealth and has a valid operator's license issued by the state where he is domiciled, and who is occupying a seat beside the driver; provided, however, that in the case of a motorized bicycle, no such accompanying operator shall be required; and provided, further, that if the applicant has been issued a learner's permit restricted to the operation of a motorcycle, said learner's permit shall not entitle him to carry any passenger while operating such motorcycle upon any way or to operate a motorcycle upon any way at any time after sunset or before sunrise; and provided, further, that anything to the contrary contained in this section notwithstanding, all learner's permits restricted to the operation of motorcycles shall be valid for six months from the date of issue or until the holder shall have received a license to operate motorcycles, whichever first occurs; and the holder of such motorcycle learner's permit may take not more than three driving tests within said six month period upon payment of the fee required by section thirty-three.
