**Chap. 207. AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF KENNETH J. WATSON AS A POLICE OFFICER IN THE CITY OF NORTHAMPTON.**

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of section fifty-eight of chapter thirty-one of the General Laws, the personnel administrator is hereby directed to certify Kenneth J. Watson for the eligible list for appointment as a police officer in the city of Northampton as if he had resided in said city for one year prior to the taking of his examination provided that he meets all other requirements of said chapter.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

**Chap. 208. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THOMAS J. EGAN TO TAKE A CIVIL SERVICE EXAMINATION FOR POLICE OFFICER NOTWITHSTANDING THE MAXIMUM AGE REQUIREMENTS.**

Whereas, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to immediately authorize Thomas J. Egan to take a civil service examination for police officer, therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience. \_\_\_\_\_

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Notwithstanding the provisions of any law or rule to the contrary regulating the maximum age for applicants for appointment as a police officer, Thomas J. Egan of the city of Gloucester shall be eligible to take the next open competitive examination
