AN ACT

To authorize the Trustees of the Smith College to hold
Additional Real and Personal Estate.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 Section three of chapter seventy-one of the acts
2 of the year eighteen hundred and seventy-one, as
3 amended by chapter fifty-seven of the acts of the
4 year eighteen hundred and ninety-one, is hereby
5 further amended by striking out the words “*pro-*
6 *vided*, that the clear annual income of the same shall
7 not exceed two hundred thousand dollars”, and by
8 inserting after the word “*holding*”, in the tenth
9 line of said section three, as amended, the words:
10 —in any amount,—so that said section as
11 amended shall read as follows:—*Section 3.* The
12 said corporation may have a common seal, which
13 it may alter or renew at its pleasure, and all deeds
14 sealed with the seal of said corporation and signed
15 by its order shall, when made in the corporate
16 name, be considered in law as the deeds of the said
17 corporation; and said corporation may sue and be

18 sued in all actions, real, personal or mixed, and may
19 prosecute the same to final judgment and execution
20 by the name of the Trustees of the Smith College;
21 and said corporation shall be capable of taking and
22 holding in any amount and in fee simple or any
23 less estate, by gift, grant, bequest, devise or other-
24 wise, any lands, tenements or other estate, real or
25 personal.
