## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fourteen.

### AN ACT

Relative to the Employment of a Storekeeper in the Department of the District Police.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The chief of the district police is hereby  
2 authorized to employ a storekeeper in his department at  
3 an annual salary of seven hundred and fifty dollars, to  
4 increase by yearly increments of fifty dollars until it  
5 reaches the sum of nine hundred dollars: *provided*, that  
6 such increase is approved, from year to year, by the chief  
7 of the district police, for the efficiency and faithfulness  
8 of such storekeeper; and *further provided*, that the pres-  
9 ent employee performing the duties of storekeeper shall  
10 receive an annual salary of nine hundred dollars during  
11 his occupancy of such position.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
