

ACTS, 1983. - Chaps. 379, 380.

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any law or rule regulating the maximum age of applicants for appointment as a police officer, Thomas A. Giannino shall be eligible to take the next open competitive examination for Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority police officer, and provided he meets all other requirements, he shall be eligible for certification and appointment.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

Chap. 379. AN ACT AUTHORIZING EDMUND JOSEPH SANSEVERINO TO TAKE A CIVIL SERVICE EXAMINATION FOR CORRECTIONAL OFFICER NOTWITHSTANDING THE MAXIMUM AGE REQUIREMENTS.

Whereas, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to immediately authorize Edmund Joseph Sanseverino to take a civil service examination for correctional officer, therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Notwithstanding the provisions of section four of chapter one hundred and twenty-five of the General Laws or any other law or rule regulating the maximum age of applicants for appointment as a correctional officer, Edmund Joseph Sanseverino of the town of Rockland shall be eligible to take the next open competitive examination for correctional officer and, provided he meets all other requirements, he shall be eligible for certification and appointment.

Chap. 380. AN ACT AUTHORIZING IRENE M. LANDRY TO TAKE A CIVIL SERVICE EXAMINATION FOR POLICE OFFICER NOTWITHSTANDING THE MAXIMUM AGE REQUIREMENTS.

Whereas, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to immediately authorize Irene M. Landry to take a civil service examination for police officer,
