

ACTS, 1983. - Chaps. 388, 389.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law or rule to the contrary regulating the maximum age of an applicant for appointment as police officer, Clifford C. Wilson shall be eligible to take the next open competitive examination for appointment to the position of police officer and, provided he meets all other requirements, shall be eligible for certification and appointment.

Chap. 388. AN ACT AUTHORIZING CHARLES T. WALSH TO TAKE A CIVIL SERVICE EXAMINATION FOR POLICE OFFICER NOTWITHSTANDING THE MAXIMUM AGE REQUIREMENTS.

Whereas, The deferred operation of this act would tend to defeat its purpose, which is to immediately authorize Charles T. Walsh to take a civil service examination for police officer, therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public convenience. _____

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Chap. 389. AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF HOSPITAL RATES OF PAYMENT AND CHARGES.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 6A of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out section 51A, as inserted by section 1B of chapter 372 of the acts of 1982, and inserting in place thereof the following section:-

Section 51A - For each acute hospital with a fiscal year be-
