

Bill accompanying the petition of George B. Leonard and others relative to the open season on ruffed grouse, quail and woodcock. Fisheries and Game. January 19.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifteen.

AN ACT

Relative to the Open Season on Ruffed Grouse, Quail and Woodcock.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful, excepting only be-
2 tween the first day of November and the thirtieth day of
3 November following, both dates inclusive, to hunt, pursue,
4 take or kill a ruffed grouse, commonly called partridge, or
5 a woodcock, or a quail, commonly called "Bob White",
6 or to have the same or any part thereof in possession,
7 whenever or wherever the same have been taken or killed.

1 SECTION 2. It shall be unlawful at any time to buy,
2 sell, offer for sale or otherwise dispose of, a ruffed grouse,
3 woodcock or quail, or any part thereof, whenever or
4 wherever the same may have been taken or killed.

1 SECTION 3. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent
2 herewith are hereby repealed.
