AN ACT

Relative to Certain Notices to be given to Female Voters by Registrars.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section forty-four of Part I of chapter eight hundred
2 and thirty-five of the acts of the year nineteen hundred
3 and thirteen is hereby amended by inserting after the
4 word "male", in the last sentence but one of the said
5 section, the words:— and female, — and also by insert-
6 ing after the word "his", in the same sentence, the
7 words:— or her, — so that the said sentence will read
8 as follows:— They shall, on or before the first Monday
9 of August in each year, send notice in writing by mail
10 to each male and female voter of the preceding year
11 whose name has not been entered in the annual register of
12 the current year if his or her name has not been so en-
13 tered.
