

Bill accompanying the petition of Charles H. Pearson relative to limiting voting in conventions of political parties to certain persons. Election Laws. January 21.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifteen.

AN ACT

To limit Voting in Conventions of Political Parties to Persons elected as Delegates or Alternate Delegates.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Each town, ward of a city and district,
2 entitled to delegates to any convention of political
3 parties, in electing delegates to any such convention shall,
4 at the same time and in the same manner, elect a like
5 number of alternate delegates, and no person shall par-
6 ticipate in any such convention by voting therein unless
7 he has been duly elected as a delegate or as an alternate
8 delegate thereto and has his credential to that effect.

1 SECTION 2. Any person violating the provisions of
2 section one of this act shall be subject to a fine of not
3 more than five hundred dollars or to imprisonment of
4 not more than ninety days or to both fine and imprison-
5 ment.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

THE COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS

AN ACT

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in and for the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, that the following provisions shall be and they are hereby enacted, to have full force and effect from and after the date of the publication of this act in the Commonwealth:

Section 1. The Secretary of the State shall be and he is hereby authorized to cause to be printed and distributed to the members of the Legislature, and to the public, at the expense of the State, a copy of the laws of the Commonwealth, and to provide for the printing and distribution of the laws of the Commonwealth, and to provide for the printing and distribution of the laws of the Commonwealth.

Section 2. Any person violating the provisions of this act shall be liable to a fine of not more than five hundred dollars, or to imprisonment for not more than three months, or to both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 3. This act shall take effect from the passage
