## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifteen.

### AN ACT

Relative to the Maintenance of Horses for the Militia.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section one of chapter seven hundred and  
2 fifty-eight of the acts of the year nineteen hundred and  
3 fourteen is hereby amended by striking out the first sen-  
4 tence of said section and substituting in place thereof  
5 the following:— There may be allowed and paid out of  
6 the treasury of the commonwealth a sum not exceeding  
7 ten thousand dollars, and from this sum there shall be  
8 allowed and paid to each troop of cavalry and battery  
9 of field artillery and other military organizations author-  
10 ized to have mounted officers or enlisted men, or to have  
11 pack transportation, an amount not exceeding fifteen dol-  
12 lars each month for every horse or mule owned by such  
13 organization or by individual members thereof and used  
14 for military purposes.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
