AN ACT

Relative to Half-holidays for Laborers, Workmen and Mechanics employed by or on behalf of the Commonwealth.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section one of chapter six hundred and eighty-
- 2 eight of the acts of the year nineteen hundred and
- 3 fourteen is hereby amended by inserting after the
- 4 word "year", in the seventh line, the follow-
- 5 ing: or its equivalent in working hours, so as
- 6 to read as follows: Section 1. All laborers,
- 7 workmen and mechanics employed by the common-
- 8 wealth in any capacity, or by any officer, board or
- 9 commission on behalf of the commonwealth, who
- 10 are permanent employees or who have been certi-
- 11 fied by the civil service commission and whose
- 12 services can be dispensed with, shall be given a
- 13 half-holiday on every Saturday in the year, or its
- 14 equivalent in working hours, without loss of pay.
