RESOLVE

Providing for the Representation of the Commonwealth at
the Panama-Pacific International Exposition.

1 *Resolved*, That there be allowed and paid from the ap-
2 propriation authorized by chapter one hundred and
3 twenty-five of the resolves of the year nineteen hundred
4 and thirteen, a sum not exceeding five thousand dollars,
5 to be expended under the direction of the governor and
6 council, to enable the commonwealth to be represented
7 after the prorogation of the present session of the general
8 court at the Panama-Pacific International Exposition,
9 held in the city of San Francisco, in the state of Cali-
10 fornia, by the following officials, to wit: — His excellency
11 the governor; or his honor the lieutenant governor; two
12 members of the staff of the governor; the president of
13 the senate; the speaker of the house; one member of the
14 committee on federal relations on the part of the senate,
15 to be appointed by the president; one member of the com-
16 mittee on federal relations on the part of the house, to
17 be appointed by the speaker; one other member of the
18 senate, to be appointed by the president; three other mem-
19 bers of the house, to be appointed by the speaker; and the
20 sergeant-at-arms.
