AN ACT

Relative to the Wages of Certain Employees of the Metropolitan Water and Sewerage Board and of the Metropolitan Park Commission.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The minimum daily wage of all
2 laborers in the service of the metropolitan water
3 and sewerage board or of the metropolitan park
4 commission shall be three dollars.

1 SECTION 2. All foremen, workmen and me-
2 chanics in said service shall hereafter receive an
3 increase in wages equivalent to ten per cent of
4 their present compensation.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.

In the Matter of the City of New York

AN ACT

To amend the Charter of the City of New York, in relation to the Commission of the City of New York, and to amend the laws in relation thereto.

Enacted by the Senate and Assembly of the State of New York, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seven.

Section 1. The Commission of the City of New York shall consist of five members, to be appointed by the Board of Estimate and Taxation, one of whom shall be the Mayor of the City of New York.

Section 2. The Commission of the City of New York shall have the honor and the power of a corporation, and shall be subject to the provisions of the laws relating to corporations.
