The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty.

AN ACT

To Abolish the Fee for the Registration of School Teachers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section one of chapter seven hundred and thirty-one of
2 the acts of nineteen hundred and eleven, as amended,
3 is hereby further amended by striking out the words
4 "upon the payment of a fee of two dollars", in the first
5 sentence, and by striking out the words "beyond the
6 aforesaid fee", in the third sentence, so as to read as fol-
7 lows:— *Section 1.* Any graduate of any high school or
8 normal school in this commonwealth, or of any other
9 school considered by the board of education to be of
10 equal grade, or the graduate of any reputable college,
11 provided that such graduate is a person of good character,
12 may file an application with the board of education for a
13 position as school teacher. The application shall set forth
14 the name, address, and, briefly, the experience and quali-

15 fications of the applicant. It shall be the duty of the
16 board of education to communicate with the school com-
17 mittees in the cities and towns of the commonwealth,
18 and with persons who have made application for a posi-
19 tion as school teacher in accordance with the provisions of
20 this section, and to procure positions for them so far as
21 may be possible, free of expense to the applicant, and
22 without expense to the various school committees.
