Bill accompanying the petition of E. Gerry Brown relative to creating a bureau of elevator inspection in the Department of Public Safety, State Administration. January 15.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty.

AN ACT

Creating a Bureau of Elevator Inspection in the Department of Public Safety.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. All cities and towns of this common-
2 wealth shall provide for a bureau of elevator inspection
3 to be in charge of a chief inspector and including any
4 number of inspectors of five or more years experience in
5 the construction, repair or inspection of elevators, as may
6 be needed for the proper management of said bureau.
7 The salary of the chief inspector and other inspectors
8 and employees shall be equal at least to the wage paid
9 for similar work by reputable manufacturers in the
10 elevator industry. In cities or towns containing a
11 building department the said bureau shall form a part of
12 said department, and in all cities and towns not having

13 a building department, the inspection of all elevators
14 shall be under the supervision of the building department
15 of the department of public safety.

1 SECTION 2. On and after the passage of this act every
2 power elevator in any city or town of this common-
3 wealth shall be examined once in every six months; and
4 every hand elevator once a year, the safety of the public
5 demanding the same.

1 SECTION 3. The chief inspector may at any time with
2 the approval of the commissioner of public safety make
3 any additional recommendation that has for its purpose
4 the better safeguarding of the public travel providing
5 it does not conflict with the acts of nineteen hundred
6 and thirteen, chapter eight hundred and six, governing
7 the erection and repairing of elevators.

1 SECTION 4. Cities and towns may provide the penalties
2 which shall be charged against and recoverable from
3 those using elevators, or hoists in violation of the provi-
4 sions of the ordinances regarding the same, or the regula-
5 tions of the bureau adopted in accordance with the
6 provision of such ordinance, and may wholly forbid the
7 use of any elevator or hoist not complying with the
8 requirements thereof; and may also apply to the proper
9 court of common pleas for injunction whensoever in the
10 opinion of said bureau the exigency of the particular
11 cause may require it.

1 SECTION 5. This act to take effect within sixty days
2 after its passage and any act not in accordance with the
3 same is hereby repealed.
