## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty.

### AN ACT

To establish the Salary of the Librarian of the State Library.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section twenty-six of chapter ten of the  
2 Revised Laws, as amended by section one of chapter  
3 four hundred and twenty-one of the acts of nineteen hun-  
4 dred and ten, is hereby amended by striking out the  
5 word "four", in the fourth line, and substituting the  
6 word:— five, — so as to read as follows:— *Section 1.*  
7 The governor, with the advice and consent of the coun-  
8 cil, shall appoint a librarian of the state library who shall  
9 hold office during their pleasure and shall receive an  
10 annual salary of five thousand dollars.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall not take effect until a  
2 sufficient appropriation therefor is made at the present  
3 session of the general court, and then as of the first day  
4 of June in the current year.
