AN ACT

Relative to the Appointment of Substitutes for
Certain City Officials in Fall River.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The city treasurer, the city col-
2 lector and the city auditor of the city of Fall
3 River shall each appoint one of their respective
4 male clerks as assistant treasurer, assistant col-
5 lector and assistant auditor. Said assistants shall,
6 in cases which will not admit of delay, perform all
7 the duties and exercise all the authority now con-
8 ferred by law or ordinance upon their respective
9 chiefs, in the event of their absence, disability or
10 of a vacancy in the office.

1 SECTION 2. The appointing officer shall in
2 each case file notice of the appointment with the
3 mayor and city clerk and the same shall continue
4 in force until revoked by the appointing officer.
