RESOLVE

To compensate Joseph Donato of New Bedford.

1 *Resolved*, That there be allowed and paid out of the
2 treasury of the commonwealth to Joseph Donato of New
3 Bedford the sum of sixty-four dollars monthly for a period
4 of five years as compensation for injuries sustained by
5 him in October, nineteen hundred and nineteen, while in
6 the performance of his duties as a member of the state
7 guard, doing strike duty in the city of Boston. Said
8 payments to commence with the date this resolve goes
9 into effect.
