The committee on Constitutional Amendments, to whom was referred the petition of Benjamin Loring Young for an amendment of the constitution relative to the right of women to vote for governor, lieutenant-governor, senators and representatives, reports, in accordance with the provisions of joint rule 23, that the proposal for an amendment contained in the resolve accompanying the same (House, No. 1825) ought to pass, with an amendment substituting therefor the accompanying Proposal for a Legislative Amendment to the Constitution relative to the Qualifications of Voters for Certain State Officers (Senate, No. 600).

Proposal for a Legislative Amendment to the Constitution relative to the Qualifications of Voters for Certain State Officers.

1 The joint session of the senate and house of representa-
2 tives hereby declares it to be expedient to alter the
3 constitution by the adoption of the following article of
4 amendment, to the end that it may become a part of the
5 constitution, if similarly agreed to in joint session of the
6 next general court and approved by the people at the
7 state election next following:

ARTICLE OF AMENDMENT.

1 Article III of the amendments to the constitution, as
2 amended, is hereby further amended by striking out, in
3 the first line, the word "male".
