

HOUSE No. 812

Accompanying the petition of James J. Mellen for the abolition of the Licensing Board for the City of Boston and the transfer of its duties to the Police Commissioner for the City of Boston. Cities. January 19.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-One.

AN ACT

To abolish the Licensing Board for the City of Boston, and to transfer its Duties to the Police Commissioner for the City of Boston.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The licensing board for the city of Boston,
2 established under the provisions of chapter two hundred
3 and ninety-one of the acts of the year nineteen hundred
4 and six, and acts in amendment thereof and in addition
5 thereto, is hereby abolished.

1 SECTION 2. All the powers heretofore vested in and
2 the duties heretofore imposed by law upon the licensing
3 board for the city of Boston under the provisions of
4 chapter two hundred and ninety-one of the acts of nine-

5 teen hundred and six, and acts in amendment thereof and
6 in addition thereto shall be and the same hereby are
7 vested in and imposed upon the police commissioner of
8 the city of Boston.

1 SECTION 3. The police commissioner may by general
2 or special order delegate the duty of granting, suspending
3 or revoking any or all licenses heretofore under the con-
4 trol of the licensing board for the city of Boston, to the
5 superintendent of police of the city of Boston, and upon
6 such delegation the said superintendent of police shall
7 have and perform all of the powers and duties heretofore
8 exercised by the licensing board for the city of Boston.
