Accompanying the petition of John P. Kyte and others that the board of public works of the town of Framingham be abolished. Towns. January 20.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-One.

AN ACT

To abolish the Board of Public Works in the Town of Framingham.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter seven hundred and one of the
2 acts and resolves of the year nineteen hundred and four-
3 teen and chapter three hundred and fifty-eight of the
4 Special Acts and Resolves of the year nineteen hundred
5 and fifteen, establishing a commission of public works in
6 the town of Framingham are hereby repealed.

1 SECTION 2. Upon the abolition of said commission of
2 public works, the powers and duties of said commission
3 shall vest in the board of selectmen. No contracts or
4 liabilities existing at the time of the acceptance of this

5 act shall be affected thereby, but the board of selectmen
6 shall be in all respects and for all purposes whatsoever
7 the lawful successor of the said commission of public
8 works.

1 SECTION 3. This act, except as is provided in section
2 four, shall take effect upon its acceptance by a majority
3 of the voters of the town of Framingham present and
4 voting thereon at any legal town meeting called for that
5 purpose, but the number of meetings so called shall not
6 exceed three.

1 SECTION 4. So much of this act as authorizes its sub-
2 mission as aforesaid shall take effect upon its passage.
