## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

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In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-One.

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### AN ACT

To provide for removing or placing Underground Certain Wires and Electrical Appliances in the City of Boston.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. In the month of January in the year nine-  
2 teen hundred and twenty-two and in the month of Janu-  
3 ary in each year thereafter, to and including the year  
4 nineteen hundred and twenty-six, the fire commissioner  
5 in the city of Boston shall prescribe and give public  
6 notice thereof in at least two daily newspapers in said  
7 city, by advertisement therein, twice a week for two  
8 weeks in succession, of not more than four miles of  
9 streets in any one year, from which poles shall be re-  
10 moved and the wires buried underground.

1 SECTION 2. The work for the years nineteen hundred  
2 and twenty and nineteen hundred and twenty-one here-  
3 tofore prescribed under existing statutes need not be done  
4 but any street or streets formerly included in the work  
5 prescribed for said years may be included by the fire  
6 commissioner in the future work to be done under  
7 this act. The obligation to do any work prescribed under

8 existing laws to be done in years before nineteen hundred  
9 and twenty shall not be affected by anything in this act  
10 contained.

1 SECTION 3. The powers conferred and the duties im-  
2 posed upon the officer mentioned in chapter three hun-  
3 dred and sixty-four of the acts of the year nineteen hun-  
4 dred and eleven, and other acts mentioned in said chapter,  
5 are hereby extended and said powers shall be exercised  
6 and said duties performed by said fire commissioner in  
7 each of the years nineteen hundred and twenty-two to  
8 nineteen hundred and twenty-six, inclusive.

1 SECTION 3. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent here-  
2 with are hereby repealed.
