AN ACT

Authorizing the Town of Middlefield to Incur Indebtedness for Highway Purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. For the purpose of meeting the town's
2 share of the cost of the highway constructed in accordance
3 with chapter five hundred and sixty-six of the acts of
4 nineteen hundred and twenty, the town of Middlefield
5 may borrow from time to time such sums as may be
6 necessary, not exceeding in the aggregate ten thousand
7 dollars, and may issue bonds or notes therefor which
8 shall bear on their face the words, Middlefield Highway
9 Loan, Act of 1922. Each authorized issue shall con-
10 stitute a separate loan, and such loans shall be payable
11 in not more than ten years from their date. Indebted-
12 ness incurred under this act shall be in excess of the
13 statutory limit, but, except as herein provided, shall be
14 subject to chapter forty-four of the General Laws.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
