AN ACT

Authorizing the Town of Oxford to incur Indebtedness for School Purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. For the purpose of acquiring land and
2 erecting a school building in that part of the town of
3 Oxford known as Oxford Plains, and for the purpose of
4 acquiring land and erecting a school building in that
5 portion of the town of Oxford known as North Oxford,
6 and for the purchase of furnishings and original equip-
7 ment for said buildings, the town of Oxford may borrow
8 from time to time a sum not exceeding the sum of one
9 hundred thousand dollars, and may issue notes therefor
10 which shall bear on their face the words "Oxford School
11 Loan Act of nineteen hundred twenty-two"; each au-
12 thorized issue shall constitute a separate loan. Indebted-
13 ness incurred under this act shall be in excess of the
14 statutory limit, but shall otherwise be subject to chapter
15 forty-four of the General Laws.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
