
Accompanying the petition of Edmond P. Talbot that the city of Fall River be authorized to incur indebtedness for the providing of public baths. Municipal Finance. January 16.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Three.

AN ACT

Authorizing the City of Fall River to Borrow Money for the Construction, Equipping and Providing Public Baths.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. For the purpose of purchasing or otherwise
2 acquiring land, and constructing thereon public bath or
3 baths and providing for the original equipment and
4 furnishings of said bath or baths, the city of Fall River
5 may from time to time borrow such sums as may be
6 necessary, not exceeding, in the aggregate, one hundred
7 and twenty-five thousand dollars, and may issue notes or
8 bonds therefor, which shall bear on their face the words
9 "City of Fall River Bath House Loan, Act of 1923." Each
10 authorized loan shall constitute a separate loan, and such
11 loans shall be payable in not more than twenty years.
12 Each authorized issue shall constitute a separate loan.
13 Indebtedness incurred under this act shall be in excess of
14 the statutory limit, and shall, except as provided herein,
15 be subject to chapter forty-four of the General Laws.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
