AN ACT

Relative to the Venue of Certain Specific Crimes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter two hundred and sixty-five of the General
- 2 Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section twenty-
- 3 four the following new section:—
- 4 *Section 24A.* If, in connection with the alleged com-
- 5 mission of a crime described in section twenty-two,
- 6 twenty-three or twenty-four, the female against whom
- 7 said crime is alleged to have been committed has been
- 8 conveyed from the territorial jurisdiction of one court
- 9 into that of another, said crime may be prosecuted and
- 10 punished in the judicial district where committed or from
- 11 which such female was so conveyed.
