### AN ACT

Reviving The Beacon Falls Rubber Shoe Company.

1 *Whereas*, The deferred operation of this act would  
2 cause inconvenience and expense, therefore it is hereby  
3 declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the im-  
4 mediate preservation of the public convenience.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the  
same, as follows:*

1 The Beacon Falls Rubber Shoe Company, a corpora-  
2 tion dissolved by chapter two hundred and three of the  
3 acts of nineteen hundred and twenty-three, is hereby  
4 revived with the same powers, duties and obligations as  
5 if said chapter had not been passed.

The Constitution of the State of New York

Article XXII, Section 1, Paragraph 1, Subsection 1

AN ACT

to amend the laws relating to the State of New York

Enacted by the Senate and Assembly of the State of New York at the 107th Session, held at the Capitol, Albany, on the 14th day of March, 1894.
