RESOLVE

Requesting the Attorney-General to hear the Claims of Persons who allege Property Damage by Reason of the Construction and Use of the Armory in the Charlestown District of the City of Boston.

1 *Resolved*, That the attorney-general is hereby requested
2 to hear the claims of persons who allege damage to their
3 property by reason of the occupation and use thereof by
4 the commonwealth in connection with the construction
5 and maintenance of the Charlestown armory on Bunker
6 Hill street in the Charlestown district of the city of Bos-
7 ton, and to report the names of persons whose property
8 has been so damaged, and the amounts of damages sus-
9 tained by such persons, and whether or not there is any
10 legal or other obligation on the part of the commonwealth
11 in relation thereto. The attorney-general is hereby fur-
12 ther requested to file his report with the clerk of the
13 house of representatives on or before the fifteenth day of
14 October of the current year, and at the same time file a
15 copy of the same with the budget commissioner as a part
16 of the budget estimates required to be submitted under
17 section four of chapter twenty-nine of the General Laws.
