## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

---

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Four.

---

Resolve providing for a Proper Representation of the Commonwealth at the National Encampment of the Grand Army of the Republic in the City of Boston during the Present Year.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 *Resolved*, That for the purpose of uniting with  
2 the veterans of the war of the rebellion in a proper  
3 observance of the fifty-ninth anniversary of the ter-  
4 mination of the said war and of assisting the grand  
5 army of the republic in holding its national encamp-  
6 ment of the present year in the city of Boston, and  
7 thereby enabling the commonwealth to offer in tes-  
8 timony of its appreciation of their service to the na-  
9 tion a fitting hospitality to the veteran soldiers,  
10 there be allowed and paid out of the treasury of the  
11 commonwealth a sum not exceeding twenty-five  
12 thousand dollars to be expended under the direction  
13 of the governor and council in such manner as they  
14 shall deem proper.
