
By Mr. Drew of Boston, petition of the Boston Retirement Board relative to the disposition of sums payable to the city of Boston by the Commonwealth in reimbursement for certain pensions and retirement allowances paid by the city of Boston to retired school teachers. The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Four.

An Act relative to the Disposition of Sums Payable to the City of Boston by the Commonwealth in Reimbursement for Certain Pensions and Retirement Allowances paid by the City to Retired School Teachers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter two hundred and eighty-
2 nine of the special acts of nineteen hundred and six-
3 teen is hereby amended by striking out section one
4 and inserting in place thereof the following:—
5 *Section 1.* The sums payable by the common-
6 wealth to the city of Boston under the provisions
7 of section sixteen of chapter thirty-two of the Gen-
8 eral Laws as reimbursement for certain pensions
9 and retirement allowances paid by the city to re-
10 tired school teachers shall, in the case of all teach-
11 ers retired by the Boston retirement board under
12 the provisions of the Boston retirement act, the
13 same being chapter five hundred and twenty-one of
14 the acts of nineteen hundred and twenty-two, be

15 paid into the pension accumulation fund established
16 by section six of said act; and in the case of all
17 teachers retired by the school committee of the city
18 of Boston under the provisions of chapter five hun-
19 dred and eighty-nine of the acts of nineteen hun-
20 dred and eight as amended by chapter six hundred
21 and seventeen of the acts of nineteen hundred and
22 ten shall be paid into the permanent school pension
23 fund established by section one of said chapter five
24 hundred and eighty-nine.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
