

By Mr. Kelly of Boston, petition of Coleman E. Kelly that the sale of patent medicines containing more than six per cent of alcohol be prohibited except upon prescription of a physician. Public Health. Dec. 27, 1923.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Four.

An Act prohibiting the Sale of Patent Medicines containing more than Six Per Cent Alcohol except upon Prescription of a Physician.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section thirty-five of chapter one
2 hundred and twelve of the General Laws, as
3 amended by section fifteen of chapter four hundred
4 and twenty-seven of the acts of nineteen hundred
5 and twenty-two, is hereby further amended by in-
6 serting after the word " medicines " in the ninth
7 line the words:— containing less than six per cent
8 alcohol.

1 SECTION 2. Said chapter one hundred and twelve
2 is hereby further amended by inserting after sec-
3 tion thirty-five the following new section:—

4 *Section 35A.* No registered pharmacist shall sell
5 any patent or proprietary medicine which contains
6 more than six per cent alcohol except upon the
7 prescription of a registered physician.
