In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Four.

---

An Act amending the Act authorizing the Town of Hudson to borrow Money for School Purposes.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section one of chapter four hundred and seven-  
2 teen of the acts of nineteen hundred and twenty-  
3 three is hereby amended by striking out, in the first  
4 line, the word " a ", by striking out in the same line  
5 the word " high ", by striking out, in the second and  
6 third lines the word " building " and inserting in  
7 place thereof the word:— buildings,— and by  
8 striking out in the seventh line the figures " nine-  
9 teen hundred and twenty-three " and inserting in  
10 place thereof the figures:— nineteen hundred and  
11 twenty-four,—so as to read as follows:—*Section 1.*  
12 For the purpose of constructing new school build-  
13 ings and for the original equipment and furnishing  
14 of said buildings, the town of Hudson may borrow  
15 from time to time such sums as may be necessary,  
16 not exceeding, in the aggregate, one hundred and  
17 fifty thousand dollars, and may issue bonds or notes  
18 therefor, which shall bear on their face the words,

19 Hudson School Loan, Act of 1924. Each authorized  
20 issue shall constitute a separate loan. Indebtedness  
21 incurred under this act shall be in excess of the  
22 statutory limit, but shall, except as provided herein,  
23 be subject to chapter forty-four of the General  
24 Laws.
