In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Four.

An Act providing for the Dissolution of an Attachment of Real Property if no Service is made upon the Defendant.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter two hundred and twenty-three of the General
2 Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section one
3 hundred and fifteen the following new section:—

4 *Section 115A.* If real property of the defendant is
5 attached in any action and no service is made upon him,
6 the attachment shall be dissolved unless it appears of
7 record that notice of such action has been given to him,
8 in such manner as the court orders, within one year after
9 the entry of the action.
