

HOUSE No. 976

By Mr. Edward J. Kelley of Worcester, petition of Edward J. Kelley that certain applicants for employment under the civil service laws be not required to state whether or not they have been convicted of crime. Public Service. Jan. 16, 1924.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Four.

An Act relative to Applications for Appointment or Employment under the Civil Service of Persons Eighteen Years of Age or under.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section three of chapter thirty-one of the General
2 Laws is hereby amended by inserting after the word
3 "chapter" in the twenty-third line the following
4 new clause:—

5 (g) The exemption of applicants for appoint-
6 ment or employment under the civil service,
7 eighteen years of age or under, from being required
8 to state on their applications whether or not they
9 have been convicted of a crime.
