Resolve authorizing the Reimbursement of Certain Persons for Damages sustained by Reason of the Use and Occupation of their Land.

1 *Resolved*, That, for the purpose of reimbursing Lewine
2 A. Nathanson and Marion Glickman, both of Boston,
3 whose property was, against their objection, used and
4 occupied by the commonwealth in connection with the
5 maintenance of the Charlestown armory on Bunker Hill
6 street in the Charlestown district of the city of Boston,
7 there shall be paid from the treasury of the common-
8 wealth, after an appropriation has been made and upon
9 the filing by them of releases approved by the attorney
10 general, the sum of five hundred and forty dollars to
11 Lewine A. Nathanson and the sum of one thousand four
12 hundred and forty dollars to Marion Glickman.
