

HOUSE No. 1037

By Mr. Dinsmore of Boston, petition of Robert Dinsmore for legislation rendering elective state office or employment incompatible with office or employment in the service of a public utility. Public Service. Jan. 22.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Six.

An Act rendering Elective State Office or Employment Incompatible with Office or Employment in the Service of a Public Utility.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter thirty of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by inserting after section twenty-six the
3 following new section:—

4 *Section 26A.* A person shall not at the same
5 time hold an elective office, position or employment
6 in the service of the commonwealth and any office,
7 position or employment in the service of a public
8 utility corporation. Whoever violates this section
9 shall be punished by a fine not exceeding five hun-
10 dred dollars and shall forfeit to the commonwealth
11 the compensation received by him from all offices,
12 positions or employment held by him in violation
13 thereof, to be recovered by the attorney general
14 upon written complaint within one year by any
15 citizen.
