The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Six.

An Act establishing the Salaries of the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section nine of chapter three of the Gen-
2 eral Laws, as amended by section one of chapter four
3 hundred and ninety-eight of the acts of nineteen hundred
4 and twenty-one and by section one of chapter five hun-
5 dred and two of the acts of nineteen hundred and twenty-
6 four, is hereby further amended by striking out, in the
7 seventh line, the word "fifteen" and inserting in place
8 thereof the word: — twenty-five, —* so as to read as fol-
9 lows: — *Section 9.* Each member of the general court
10 shall receive fifteen hundred dollars for each regular an-
11 nual session of the term for which he is elected, and four
12 dollars and twenty cents for every mile of ordinary trav-
13 eling distance from his place of abode to the place of
14 sitting of the general court. The president of the senate
15 and the speaker of the house of representatives shall each
16 receive twenty-five hundred dollars additional compen-
17 sation.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect on December
2 thirty-first, nineteen hundred and twenty-six.
