To the Honorable Senate and the House of Representatives.

Under the provisions of section 7 of chapter 3 of the General Laws there is submitted you herewith bill and petition which seek to revive Cape Cod Camps, Inc.

This corporation was organized under chapter 156, General Laws, for the purpose of conducting a boys' camp. The corporation has not had an impressive career so far as discharging its obligations to Massachusetts is concerned. It was delinquent in filing tax returns for 1924, 1925, 1926 and 1927. The corporation paid no attention to notices sent to it, especially a notice of January 18, 1928, which stated that it was the Commissioner of Corporations and Taxation's intention to dissolve it. The corporation applied for abatement of arbitrary taxes on February 29, 1928, while the dissolution matter was pending, but made no effort to have its name removed from the list. It was dissolved March 31, 1928, by chapter 273, Acts of 1928.

Inasmuch as this is a corporation organized for business and profit a fee of \$25 should be paid.

An Act reviving Cape Cod Camps, Inc.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Cape Cod Camps, Inc., a corporation dissolved
2 by chapter two hundred and seventy-three of the
3 acts of nineteen hundred and twenty-eight, is
4 hereby revived with the same powers, duties and
5 obligations as if said chapter had not been passed;
6 and all acts and proceedings of the officers, direc-
7 tors and stockholders of said corporation acting
8 as such which would be legal and valid but for the
9 passage of said chapter are hereby ratified and
10 confirmed.
