To the Honorable Senate and the House of Representatives.

Under the provisions of section 7 of Chapter 3 of the General Laws, there is submitted herewith petition which seeks to revive the A B C Puzzle Advertising Company.

The A B C Puzzle Advertising Company was incorporated November 23, 1925. It never actually transacted any business and never filed the returns required by law. No answer to a request made by the Commissioner as to its agreement to dissolution was received and under these circumstances the Commissioner submitted this as one of the corporations to be dissolved by the Legislature of 1928.

It now appears that the officers in charge of its affairs neglected to protect the corporation's interests to the detriment of the stockholders who now see a hope of corporate success and who claim that valuable rights exist in the corporation and wish it revived.

A fee of \$25 has been received.

An Act reviving the A B C Puzzle Advertising Company

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The A B C Puzzle Advertising Com-
2 pany, a corporation dissolved by chapter two hundred
3 and seventy-three of the acts of nineteen hundred
4 and twenty-eight, is hereby revived with the same
5 powers, duties and obligations as if said chapter had
6 not been passed.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall be operative as of
2 March thirty-first, nineteen hundred and twenty-
3 eight.
