The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Nine.

Resolve providing for a Reprinting of the General Laws, including Amendments and Additions thereto.

1 *Resolved*, That the counsel to the senate and the
2 counsel to the house of representatives be directed to
3 prepare for publication a reprint of the General Laws,
4 which shall include all amendments and additions
5 thereto to and including those enacted by the general
6 court during the session of nineteen hundred and
7 thirty. In said reprint the present chapter and sec-
8 tion numbers of the General Laws and the numbers
9 of inserted chapters and sections shall be preserved,
10 and the present marginal notations shall be supple-
11 mented or amended by notation of the substance and
12 citations of amendatory legislation and by citations
13 of decisions of the supreme judicial court rendered
14 since the publication of the General Laws. Said
15 counsel shall make a report of progress to the general
16 court, including any recommendations for the cor-
17 rection of errors, omissions, inconsistencies and im-
18 perfections which may come to their attention,
19 together with drafts of the legislation to carry the
20 same into effect, by filing the same with the clerk of
21 the house of representatives on or before December
22 first of the current year, and shall make and file as
23 aforesaid on or before December first, nineteen hun-
24 dred and thirty, a final report; and may expend for

25 the aforesaid purposes during the current year, with
26 the approval of the president of the senate and the
27 speaker of the house of representatives, such sum not
28 exceeding five thousand dollars as may hereafter be
29 appropriated by the general court, and may continue
30 the work after December first, nineteen hundred and
31 twenty-nine, upon the basis established in nineteen
32 hundred and twenty-nine, in anticipation of a further
33 appropriation.
