

HOUSE No. 1292

Mr. Sparrell of Norwell presented a petition of Ernest H. Sparrell for legislation to provide for extending the boundaries of the Duxbury Fire and Water District. Water Supply.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-Nine.

An Act extending the Boundaries of the Duxbury Fire and Water District.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The boundaries of the Duxbury fire
2 and water district, established by chapter three
3 hundred and thirteen of the acts of nineteen hundred
4 and fourteen, are hereby extended so as to include
5 the territory hereinafter described and such taxable
6 inhabitants of the town of Duxbury as reside in said
7 territory:

8 Beginning at a stake in the southerly line of West
9 street near the house formerly of Emma M. Brown-
10 rigg, now of Percy L. Walker, distant ninety-seven
11 and thirty-seven one hundredths feet from the
12 southwesterly corner of the stone foundation of the
13 house formerly of Samuel E. Hathaway and now of
14 Nepton, measured south eighty and one half degrees
15 west; thence running westerly by West street to
16 land formerly of Elizabeth M. Hathaway; thence
17 running southwesterly to the southeasterly corner of

18 said land formerly of Elizabeth M. Hathaway;
19 thence continuing in the same southwesterly direc-
20 tion in a straight line to the point of intersection with
21 the boundary line prolonged, westerly between lands
22 of Harry B. Bradley being numbered seven on Block
23 N of the assessors' map of Duxbury, and of Percy L.
24 Walker being numbered six on Block N of the as-
25 sessors' map of Duxbury; thence running easterly
26 on the prolongation of said line to the common corner
27 of said lots six and seven; thence continuing easterly
28 on the boundary line between said lots six and seven
29 to the present line of the Duxbury fire and water
30 district.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 acceptance by a majority vote of the voters of said
3 district present and voting at a meeting duly called,
4 notwithstanding the provisions of sections two and
5 three of chapter two hundred and ninety of the
6 Special Acts of nineteen hundred and fifteen.
