Resolve in favor of Thomas H. Maguire.

1 *Resolved*, That, for the purpose of discharging the
2 moral obligation of the commonwealth in the premises,
3 after an appropriation has been made, there be al-
4 lowed and paid out of the treasury the sum of
5 two thousand dollars, to the division of juvenile
6 training of the department of public welfare, for the
7 use and benefit of Thomas H. Maguire, a minor,
8 who is in the custody of said division, in full com-
9 pensation for injuries sustained by said Thomas H.
10 Maguire on March twenty-fourth, nineteen hundred
11 and twenty-eight, at the Lyman school for boys,
12 while an inmate thereof. Said division may expend
13 from said sum, such amounts as, in its discretion,
14 may be necessary for the proper maintenance and
15 education of said Thomas H. Maguire during his
16 minority; and when said Maguire becomes twenty-
17 one years of age the said division shall pay to him
18 any unexpended balance remaining from said sum.
19 Nothing herein shall be construed as abridging the
20 powers of said division relative to the custody of said
21 Maguire.
