## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty.

An Act relative to the Pensioning of Foremen, Inspectors, Mechanics, Draw Tenders, Assistant Draw Tenders and Storekeepers in the Employ of the City of Cambridge.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Any foreman, inspector, mechanic, draw  
2 tender, assistant draw tender or storekeeper, in the  
3 employ of the city of Cambridge, retired from service  
4 under the provisions of section seventy-seven of  
5 chapter thirty-two of the General Laws, shall receive  
6 from said city for the remainder of his life an annual  
7 pension equal to one half of the annual compensation  
8 paid to him as such foreman, inspector, mechanic,  
9 draw tender, assistant draw tender or storekeeper,  
10 at his retirement.

11 Section seventy-seven B of said chapter thirty-two  
12 of the General Laws, in so far as it limits the amount  
13 of pension which may be received, shall not apply to  
14 foremen, inspectors, mechanics, draw tenders, assist-  
15 ant draw tenders or storekeepers in the employ of the  
16 city of Cambridge.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its  
2 acceptance by vote of the city council of the said city,  
3 subject to the provisions of its charter, provided such  
4 acceptance occurs prior to the thirty-first day of  
5 December in the current year.
