HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, Feb. 14, 1930.

The committee on Military Affairs, to whom were referred the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 36) of William S. Conroy that certain organizations be authorized to parade with music on the Sunday next preceding or following Armistice Day, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 100) of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States that said organization and the Grand Army of the Republic, the United Spanish War Veterans and The American Legion be authorized to parade with music on the Lord's Day preceding Armistice Day, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 101) of Thomas Smith, Jr., and others that the Grand Army of the Republic, United Spanish War Veterans, The American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States and Disabled American Veterans of the World War be authorized to parade with music on the Lord's Days preceding Memorial Day, Armistice Day, Spanish War Memorial Day and Maine Memorial Day, and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 548) of the Department of Massachusetts, The American Legion, that posts of The American Legion or of the Veterans of Foreign Wars be permitted to parade with music on the Sunday next preceding Armistice Day, report the accompanying bill (House, No. 1049).

## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty.

An Act permitting War Veterans' Organizations to parade with Music on the Lord's Day.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter one hundred and thirty-six of the General  
2 Laws, as amended in section ten by chapter one  
3 hundred and nineteen of the acts of nineteen hundred  
4 and twenty-two, is hereby further amended by strik-  
5 ing out said section and inserting in place thereof the  
6 following:—

7 *Section 10.* Any post or camp of incorporated  
8 organizations of veterans of any war in which the  
9 United States has engaged may parade with music  
10 on the Lord's day for the purpose of attending  
11 divine service, holding commemorative exercises or  
12 dedicating memorials; provided, that the music shall  
13 be suspended while passing within two hundred feet  
14 of any place of public worship where services are  
15 being held.
