By Mr. Leonardi of Boston (by request), petition of Samuel I. Jacobs that certain safety regulations be required in the manufacture of rubberized materials. Labor and Industries.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-Five.

An Act reducing the Labor Hazard in the Rubber Industry.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section one hundred and seventeen of chapter one
2 hundred and forty-nine of the General Laws, as ap-
3 pearing in the Tercentenary edition, is hereby amended
4 by adding at the end thereof the following:—

5 No tank or boiler containing concentrated ammonia
6 gas of a degree above the lowest standard of safety,
7 shall be kept or operated in any workshop, factory or
8 establishment manufacturing rubberized materials,
9 within one hundred feet from the bench or locus of
10 employment of minors and women employees.

11 Whoever violates this section shall be punished by
12 a fine of one hundred dollars.
