By Mr. Havey of Boston, petition of Harold I. Hunt and Raymond P. Delano that county employees be entitled to perform duty with the organized militia without loss of salaries or wages. Public Service.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-Five.

An Act relative to Military Service of County Employees.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section sixty-seven of chapter thirty-three of the
2 General Laws, as most recently amended by chapter
3 one hundred and fifty-seven of the acts of nineteen
4 hundred and thirty, is hereby further amended by
5 inserting in the second line after the word "common-
6 wealth" the word:— county, — and by inserting in
7 the twelfth line after the word "commonwealth"
8 the word:— county, — so as to read as follows:—
9 *Section 67.* Any person in the service of the com-
10 monwealth, county, or of a city or town which, by
11 vote of its city council or of its inhabitants at a town
12 meeting, accepts this section, shall be entitled, dur-
13 ing the time of his service in the organized militia,
14 under sections seventeen, twenty-five, twenty-six,
15 one hundred and twenty-three and one hundred and

16 eighty-one, or during his annual tour of duty, not
17 exceeding fifteen days, as a member of the organized
18 reserve of the army of the United States or of the
19 United States naval reserve forces, to receive pay
20 therefor, without loss of his ordinary remuneration
21 as an employee or official of the commonwealth,
22 county, or such city or town, and shall also be en-
23 titled to the same leaves of absence or vacation with
24 pay given to other like employees or officials.
